20.004 Previous Minutes

It was **resolved** to approve and sign the minutes of the meeting of the Council held on 19th November 2020 as a true record.

20.005 Open Forum

In response to a parishioner's question, the Chairman reminded the meeting that the final stage of the works at the sewerage plant will include landscaping.

20.006 Community, District and County Matters

- HDC Local Plan (standing item) There were no developments to report.

- 2. Easingwold and Villages Community Forum The Chairman gave a brief report of the meeting on 5th December.
- 3. Other matters of interest Councillor Patmore (NYCC) gave the meeting an update on progress of the County Council budget for 2020/21. The government has not yet published its annual settlement so some assumptions have had to be for the draft budget. However, the current forecast is for a 3.99% rise in Council Tax for 2020/21.

20.007 Matters in hand

Matters related to fracking (standing item)

York Energy Holdings has removed its equipment from proposed fracking site at Kirby Misperton.

2. Village Plan

A number of ideas have come out of the presentation of the ecology survey, including an event or series of events to promote bird box building, identifying and recording specific habitats, and information points at village events.

There was a very good turnout for the launch of the History Group. A core group is considering the returns from questionnaires at the meeting about how the group should operate. The website is up and running - craykehistory.wordpress.com.

3. Traffic Matters

- a. West Way Works to repair and improve the drains under the road are in progress and the re-surfacing is scheduled to start on 27th January.
- b. Speed monitoring –95Alive's analysis of the monitoring on Crayke Lane shows that the mean speed of cars approaching the village is 34-36 mph and that 1 car in 6 is travelling at 40 43 mph.
- c. 30mph limit We are waiting for Highways' response to the speed monitoring report but, in light of the results, the Chairman agreed to write again asking for the 30mph limit to be moved.
- d. Parking This is an intractable problem and there is no "solution". However, if residents park with consideration for their neighbours obstructions will be considerably reduced.
- e. Various The Chairman agreed to investigate a raised manhole on Crayke Lane and hazardous concrete kerbs.

4. Village Green

a. Track below the Church

It was agreed that, before carrying out work on the track agreed at the last meeting, the following actions are needed:

- Clarify where the responsibilities for and rights of use of the track lie.
- Write to properties affected the Chairman and Vice Chairman agreed to draft a letter to be circulated to Councillors for comment
- Contact Highways to pinpoint the boundary between the roadway and the Green.

It was also agreed that the salt bin should be positioned further out towards the roadway. Councillors Featherstone and Moverley agreed to move it.

20.008 To receive and decide necessary action resulting from verbal reports from the Clerk or Councillors on matters of interest or concern

1. Key Lane

The Chairman reported an accident in which a resident had been injured when forced onto loose cobbles by a parked vehicle blocking the entrance to the Lane from the Green. Following the accident the Chairman has reported the state of the surface to Highways and written to the 4 properties around the Key Lane entrance.

2. Love Lane

Following an offer from a resident to support improvements to the Lane, the Chairman agreed to investigate options with help from Councillors Moverley and Hartley.
