20.65 Matters in hand

1. Matters related to fracking (standing item)

There have not been any developments since the government imposed a moratorium on fracking in England in November last year.

It was agreed to remove this as a standing item.

2. Village Plan

The history group is developing a guide for an historical trail around the village which will be published on the website.

3. Traffic Matters

a. Road surface updates – several roads around the village have had surface repairs or improvements over the last couple of months, including Daffy Lane and Rookery Lane. County Councillor Patmore agreed to ask Highways if they are also planning to repair the section of Crayke Lane from the Castle past Maynard House.

b. We have still not had a reply to the Chairman's letter to Highways asking for an update on progress with extending the 30mph zone. County Councillor Patmore agreed to contact the Officer responsible.

4. Village Green

The Chairman has asked the engineer responsible for the work on Love Lane for informal advice on repairing the track at the top of the Green.

County Councillor Patmore agreed to see if she could establish how far Highway's responsibility extends along the track.

5. Love Lane

There has been a site meeting with the engineer and we are expecting work to start in October. While the work is being done, Councillor Moverley has offered the team access across his land and space for storing materials.

It was noted that the path will have to be closed for a short period during the work.

6. Rights and responsibilities of farmers, walkers, and dog owners
The Chairman presented a draft notice setting out the responsibilities with regard to the use
of footpaths and rights of way within the Parish. Following some minor amendments, he
agreed to circulate a second draft for consultation.

7. Street signage

8. AJ1 Road Safety Fund

The Chairman reported that, as agreed at the last meeting, he has submitted a bid on behalf of the Council for £3,000 to purchase a Vehicle Activated Sign and that the bids will be assessed in October. Council approved the application.

[After the meeting we were informed that, because there had been a lot of applications, the assessment will be done in November].

The terms of the application require a contribution from the Council. It was **resolved** to approve £1,170 towards the purchase and maintenance of the sign.

The Chairman reported that Coxwold Parish Council have offered to lend us their speed monitor.

20.66 Village matters

- 1 In response to the latest changes to the pandemic regulations, the NALC has re-iterated its advice that Councils should continue to hold meetings remotely whenever possible.
- 2 The YLCA will hold an online branch meeting on 21st October.
- 3 Defibrillator

The Crayke Defibrillator Team have found that, although the Yorkshire Ambulance Service insist that the devices are kept in a locked cabinet for security, there is a policy that the emergency 999 operators will not give out the code number for a defibrillator when the incident location is more than 600 metres from the cabinet. Many of the properties in the parish are further than 600 m from one of the defibrillators.

It was **resolved** to

- a. support the Team's decision leave the defibrillators unlocked until the issue is resolved
- b. write jointly with the Team asking the Ambulance Service to review the policy on the

600m limit

c. contact other villages in the district which have defibrillators to notify them of the policy.
