#### 20.78 Matters in hand

1. Village Plan

It was **resolved** to carry forward the monies allocated for the project into next year.

2. Traffic Matters

We have still not had a reply to the Chairman's letter to Highways asking for an update on progress with extending the 30mph zone.

3. Village Green

We have not yet been able establish how far Highway's responsibility extends along the track. Council is also trying to identify which body, in central or local government, can authorise works on a Village Green.

It was resolved to carry forward the monies allocated to the work into next year.

#### 4. Love Lane

The resurfacing work has been completed.

5. Rights and responsibilities of farmers, walkers, and dog owners
The notice setting out the responsibilities regarding the use of footpaths and rights of way within the Parish has been published on the website.

# 6. Street signage

It was agreed to contact Hambleton District Council regarding:

- a. the sign at the Eastern end of Daffy lane, which is faded and obscured by vegetation
- b. replacing the sign at the bottom of West Way which was stolen.

It was suggested that the History Group could include information about the names of the minor roads and paths on their website.

# 7. AJ1 Road Safety Fund

We have been awarded a grant of £3,000 to purchase a Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS). There will be a meeting next week with the VAS Officer who will give advice on siting the sign, how to manage it and collect the data. The grant will be released once our plans have been approved by the Officer.

The Sign collects statistical data on traffic speeds so we will be able to judge how effective it is. It was noted that it does not capture vehicle registrations.

It was agreed that we should seek to set up a small group of villagers to manage the Sign and publish the data.

#### 8. Defibrillator

It was agreed to:

- a. Publish in the Easingwold & Thirsk Advertiser the letter that had been sent in September to nearby villages about the Ambulance Service's policy on keeping defibrillator boxes locked
- b. To endorse the decision of the Defibrillator Group's to display the unlocking code on the boxes.

# 20.79 Village matters

- 1 There has been in increase in illegal hunting and of break-ins to sheds and outhouses. Villagers are encouraged to report to the Police on the 101 number any suspicious vehicles or activity they might see. The more the problem is highlighted the more likely we are to have Police resources allocated to our area.
- Residents of Sycamore Cottages wrote to the Chairman to inform the council about their plans for a display of outdoor Christmas Lights, with an intention of including a charity box for donations. They asked for Council ideas on suitable charities. Councillors welcomed the initiative, and suggested local charities might be worthy of consideration, such as EDCCA, Yorkshire Cancer Research or Yorkshire Air Ambulance.
- A letter had been received regarding an ongoing leak from a water main at the upper end of Church Hill, which could lead to icing problems as temperatures drop.

  However, on the day of the meeting it was noted that Yorkshire Water had started exploratory work. It was agreed to keep the matter under observation to ensure it was resolved.

It was decided to survey the trees within the parish to establish their state of health and their importance to the village environment and to identify

public spaces where tree planting would be beneficial.

Councillors Hartley and Merritt agreed to develop a methodology for the survey.
